
This work was funded by the Habitat Conservation Trust Foundation (http://www.hctf.ca/), as part of HCTF's multi-year investment in Little Qualicum estuary habitat restoration. The initiative started in summer 2012 with improvements to the DFO-constructed salmon rearing channel on the Spit, led by BCCF fisheries staff, with support from the RDN, Ducks Unlimited Canada (the Spit co-owners and property managers) and BC's Living Rivers Trust Fund.

This year's re-vegetation pilots are intended to create 'nodes' of native shrub, tree and grass species which will be temporarily protected from browsing herbivores (mainly black-tail deer and feral rabbits) using traditional wire fence 'exclosures.' If exclosures are successful in safeguarding plants until they are more browse-resistant, the RDN may wish to expand their use on the Spit to enhance native riparian species.

It is envisioned the Qualicum Beach Streamkeepers will continue to play an important role in plant husbandry on the Spit, including invasive species control. Newly planted native species will also require some maintenance starting next spring, with periodic watering and fertilizer applications to give them an early growth and survival boost, especially in dry summer conditions.

Your members' obvious enthusiasm and attention to detail will be a huge asset in assisting both the RDN and BCCF with these habitat restoration goals.
